FORMER CIA OFFICIAL RAY MCGOVERN TO SPEAK AT THE UNIVERSITY OF FLORIDA

Gainesville, Fla. – A former career CIA official, Ray McGovern, will speak on September 14th at 7:30 p.m. in the Reitz Union's Grand Ballroom. McGovern will discuss "The use and abuse of intelligence and how it affects the wars we wage." His talk will discuss recent intelligence failures including the lack of any weapons of mass destruction in Iraq. He is being brought to UF by ACCENT, the International Center, and the Transnational & Global Studies Center. Admission is free and open to the public.

Ray McGovern's career as a CIA analyst spanned 27 years-- from John F. Kennedy's presidency to George H.W. Bush's. Following his retirement, he sensed that the integrity of the efforts of analysts to provide objective intelligence seemed to be in jeopardy. In response, McGovern helped found the Veteran Intelligence Professionals for Sanity (VIPS) to provide an independent critique of the politicization of the intelligence process. VIPS now includes over 40 former professionals from the CIA, the Defense Intelligence Agency, the Department of State's Bureau of Intelligence and Research, Army Intelligence, the FBI, and the National Security Agency. McGovern has written numerous articles over the past year on intelligence related issues. In addition to UF, he will speak at FIU, USF, UNF and UCF.

ACCENT Speaker's Bureau has been bringing prominent speakers to the University of Florida since the early 1960s. Previous speakers this semester include the original "Hulk" on the 1970's television show, Lou Ferrigno, and the Governor of New York, George Pataki.
